Council-Wide Project COPE

Part of the Outdoor Bronze requirements is to participate in and lead Project COPE activities. This is a team building event for our Ship. Camping at Camp Lawhorne, 11-13 Nov

Ship Projects

Build Knot Racks. 15 knots are required for Apprentice and Ordinary. They're essential for sailing. Learning them ASAP is a priority.

Paint Boat Deck. The deck of our catamaran needs to be painted. Hopefully, this will be done at the Coweta County Fair.

Develop Working PFDs. A search and rescue type PFD containing standard essentials for our Crew members is needed for on-water and wilderness survival.

Conduct Swim Checks. Before any Scout is allowed to participate in our water events, the BSA swimmer test needs to be verified. We'll usually do this at a local pool.

Develop Ship Code & By-Laws. A requirement for Apprentice is to agree to the Ship Code and By-Laws. We have to create them.

Handle Flags. If we're going to invited to perform public flag ceremonies, we need a precision team. Flag ceremonies is a primary recruiting activity as well as one for community service.

Goals to End of Year

Charter Ship 378. Five Scouts and 5 Adults are needed to formally charter Ship 378. Our challenge is to have 5 Scouts who name Ship 378 as their primary unit.

Complete Apprentice. All Scouts who join us no later than mid October, should complete Apprentice requirements by the end of December. We need to try to complete Ordinary requirements in preparation for our long cruise over Spring Break.

Uniform Ship Members. We need to make our presence known at a Coweta District and Flint River Council level. Our distinctive uniforms will do that wherever we go.

Recruit Scouts. Organizations survive by recruiting new members. Part of the purpose of the Nine Eleven Memory Walk, Camporee, and Project Cope is to make our presence known. We have a presentation to make at Scouting University, "This is Sea Scouts"

Establish Working PFD. "Be Prepared" is implemented in Boy Scouts as carrying the 10 essentials on all outings. We need to identify the emergency essentials we can carry in a search and rescue type PFD we can use on all water outings as well as land-based activities.

Form Flag-Handling Team. The most successful recruiting activity is precision performance at public flag ceremonies. We need to create a team. Our first event is the Camporee.

Uniforms

Our Ship has 3 uniforms: Dress Whites, Utility Uniform, and Class B. Only the Crew members wear the Dress Whites and Utility Uniform. All Passenger and Crew Members wear the Class B uniform.

Class B Uniform. The first uniform is Class B. It's the Americana Jersey, blue jeans, Ship baseball cap, belt, and closed-toe shoes. We'll wear this to most events. This uniform is the same for Scouts and Scouters.

Utility Uniform. The Utility Uniform is the Class B uniform with a chambray shirt worn over the jersey. The other exception is a Sea Scout web belt. This uniform is worn only by Scouts.

Dress Whites. Dress Whites are formal attire worn at special events such as flag ceremonies, public presentations, ship boarding, and Bridges of Honor. Scouts wear the Navy enlisted versions while Scouters wear the officer versions. The uniform for men and women differ.

The Americana Jersey is available at the Scout Shop or www.ScoutStuff.org for all Scouts and Scouters.

All other uniform items are procured by mail order through the Ship. Dress Whites are ordered through the Navy Exchange, Utility Shirts from Dickies, and all others from Ship Stores.

We'll try to have hats immediately available on joining.

Special Activities: 2011-2012

Swim Wear

Our Ship is in or on water a lot! Proper attire is expected. The limitation by BSA is no "revealing" swimsuits. Speedo trunks and bikinis are inappropriate. Ship 100 regularly plays in swim shorts and the equivalent of 1-piece bathing suits for women. Skipper would prefer women wear at least shorts or a skirt when off of the water while in a swim suit. The Ship Committee needs to set minimum swimming attire standards.
